## **God Uses Left-Hand for His Purpose**

August 13 is National Left-Handers Day. In honor of that day, try doing everyday tasks with your non-dominant hand: brushing your teeth, writing, cutting, dialing your phone, etc. What is easy with a person's dominate hand, can be quite difficult and challenge when a person switches to the other hand. In Judges 3:12-30 the Israelites have been under the rule of Eglon king of Moab for 18 years. They cried out to God for help, and God sent an unlikely deliverer, Ehud. The Bible is sure to note that Ehud was a left-handed man.

During that time in history hands represented two things—weakness and power. The right hand represented power (thus the Bible always refers to the Lord's right hand) and the left represented weakness. Ehud, whose name means "powerful," would be viewed as one having a disability for his left-handedness.

Swords are difficult to pull up and out and for that reason, military men wear swords on the side opposite their strongest hand. Ehud, due to the fact he was left-handed, had his sword concealed on his right thigh. Because people were not expecting a sword to be hidden on the right side, Ehud is able to get up close to Eglon and kill him with the concealed weapon and then escape unnoticed and unharmed. Because of Ehud, Israel experienced peace for 80 years!

Not your typical Sunday school Bible story, but we can learn some important lessons from it. First of all, God hears our cries and He responds. He was aware the Israelites were in a tough situation; they cried out to God and He acted. He provided Ehud to help in their situation. Whatever struggle you are facing, the first and best place to turn is to the Lord. Call out to Him; He is listening. (Read Psalm 40:1-2)

Secondly, God specifically fashioned Ehud the way he was for a specific purpose. There are no accidents or mistakes when it comes to how God formed and shaped you. Celebrate your uniqueness. (Read Psalm 139:13-16)

Finally God can use anyone for His purposes. There is no useless skill, gift or talent. Whatever God has given you, use it for His glory and His purpose. What we view as weakness, God can make into a strength. (Read 1 Corinthians 1:25-31, 2 Corinthians 12:9-10).


#### **Inspired Program Ideas**
