How to make a bow for your burlap wreath:

Why do I need a bow? The answer is you really don't, but when looking at a wreath without a bow is like looking at a cake without decoration, it's just a little sad. Just like the decorations on a cake, a bow on a wreath just looks better. The type of bow you use is entirely up to you, I choose to use tulle because I felt it gave the wreath a little more decoration.

Materials Needed:

Cardboard – 10-12 inches long Tulle Ribbon (I used 6 inch wide Tulle) Glue Gun Glue Sticks Scissors



Instructions:

Before beginning make sure you plug in your glue gun so it's ready when you need it.

Step 1:

If you are using a spool of tulle, cut a 12 inches long section. This will secure your bow and give a little extra to hang down as well.

Step 2:

Take cardboard and wrap Tulle Ribbon, I used Orange with glitter for fun O, around the cardboard about 12 times, you can wrap it more if you'd like to make the bow fuller, it's you creation so have fun with it.



Step 3:

Slip off the wrapped ribbon from the cardboard and tie the twelve inch section in the middle of the bunched tulle. Make sure your knot is tight and centered.

Step 4:

Take your scissors and cut both sides of the tulle and trim each side as needed to make a uniformed bow.



Step 5:

Take the long leftover end of your tulle that you tied to make the center knot to complete your bow look. Next, take your hot glue gun and glue the bow as well as other decorations to your wreath.



Ultimately, have fun with this project, I know I did!
