Show Love Through Friendship

If ever the world needs friends, it is now. What better way to show the love of Christ to a hurting world than through friendship. In Luke 10:25-37, through the parable of the Good Samaritan we can learn some important qualities of friendship.

A friend gives of her time. In this parable, two others passed by the injured man. Ultimately they were not willing to give of their time. Time is the most desired and most valuable commodity. No matter what we do, we can't get more time—we all have the same 24-hours a day. We can't save hours for later like a savings account; we can't borrow, trade for or steal from to receive more time. The Samaritan saw a need, and stopped. He didn't care of what was on his schedule for the day; his time was better spent here at this moment. This wasn't a quick pit-stop on his journey. He stopped and cared for his injuries and then transported him to an inn and spent the entire night watching and nursing this man back to health.

A friend gives of her emotional and physical resources. It must have been exhausting to bend down, bandage the injured man, lifting him up and placing him on his donkey, and then staying through the night to care for him. Physical exhaustion as well as emotional exhaustion didn't stop him from showing care and concern. And if that wasn't enough, he gave money to the innkeeper to continue to look after the injured man. The Samaritan never counted the cost of his time or resources. He simply gave. He truly was a friend to the man in need.

I have always wondered if the Samaritan ever connected with the injured man again? Did the injured man get to say thank you to the Samaritan. Did a friendship form? I want to believe that it did. Even if it didn't, the injured man was forever impacted by the neighborliness of the Samaritan.

Being a friend to someone in a time of need, is a great gift. The need is great today, and lots of people are looking for someone to "Just Be Friendly" to them. Are you willing to be a friend to someone today? May we show friendship by *loving God with your heart, soul, strength and mind, and loving your neighbor as yourself* (Luke 10:27).
