Just Be...Joyful!

Set Free

Right outside our back door a bird has built a nest in the rafter. One morning as I went outside to deal with some garbage, I heard a strange sound—a fluttering and a flapping. I glanced up to see a bird dangling upside down from its nest. A string she had added to the nest was caught around her leg and she couldn't fly away. She was trapped!

I watched it try to frantically escape but it would fly as far as the string and then would drop, hanging upside down. Over and over it did this. When it grew tired it would fly up to the nest but it waned desperately to fly away. I knew that if we didn't do something, this bird would eventually die.

My 14-year-old son, Sam, climbed up on a step ladder, with scissors in hand. The bird flitted about. Very nervously and carefully he took the scissors and quickly snipped the string. Instantly the bird soared free. Sam did for the bird what it couldn't do for itself. Sam served as a savior.

That is the Easter story. We were trapped in our sin and no matter what we do we cannot escape. Ever since Adam and Eve chose to disobey God and eat from the forbidden tree in Genesis 3, sin has been like the string on the bird's leg, keeping us trapped and unable to fly. All of us have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). God says that wages or payment for sin is death (Romans 6:23). When Adam and Eve tried to cover themselves with fig leaves because of the shame they felt, it didn't work. God provided a better covering—an innocent animal paid the punishment for their sins (Genesis 3:21) by giving its life to provide their clothing.

Thankfully, Romans 6:23 doesn't end with the wages of sin is death. It goes on to say but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Wages are earned; gifts are given. Just as my son cutting the bird free from its tether was gift, so too Jesus dying on the cross in our place for our sins is a gift, the greatest gift ever given.

He not only died but He rose again. That is the joyful news. On the first Easter morning when the women went to the tomb, they didn't find a body but an empty grave! Christ died but He rose again-that is where the victory is won. In the Garden of Eden, God told the serpent that he would strike the heel of the woman's offspring, but that the offspring would crush his head (Genesis 3:15). When Jesus rose from the grave the enemy of our souls was defeated. Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil—and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death (Hebrews 2:14-15).

Rejoice in the fact that because of Jesus' saving act, we have been set free from death and sin!

In Sitka, AK the ladies spent one month learning Tlingit especially through singing.


