



Be Creative. Use scrapbooking paper, newspaper, cardstock holds its shape well, pages from a book, old magazines or sheet music...







After participating in a class of mine, a friend asked me to help her to make the decorations for her summer wedding.

She had a minibudget. She used her grandmothers teacups for the centerpieces and a faux pearl glued inside her roses.

Can children make paper rose project?

YES!
Help them out with the hot glue gun, please.
I have taught children ages 6 and up.





You will need a glue gun.
And yes— use enough to hold your paper roses firmly!



Today we are making a paper rose wreath— But there are so many more great ideas I would like to share with you!



What about...

Gift tags using twine and brown paper?

Gift trim for the perfect gift!

A grouping of paper roses in a heart shape...framed, would be the perfect gift celebrating love (Think Valentine's Day, Weddings or Anniversaries).

Frame a "Garden" of paper roses!

Your wall will thank you!

And tea party or anytime decorations!

I rolled paper roses and inserted just one into each teacup on the table, scattering a few around the tabletop.

Here is a clever idea using sheets of foam that you can purchase at your local craft store.

I used felt, rolling lots of tiny roses to decorate the top of a little wood box...

Can you think of another medium?

Tissue paper using layers of 3-4 pieces are gorgeous!
