

## 2021 Territorial Projects

The Women's Department of the USA Western Territory and the following programs are thankful for the generous offering from the women of our Territory to the "Be Still" projects.

The \$30,000 you raised last year supported:

- **Chuuk Corps Community Center** – Provided a mercy seat in the chapel, new chairs, kitchen cabinets, water catchment tank covers and various sports equipment for children. These valuable upgrades allowed their corps to further their ministry with viable and creative ways to build lasting relationships and to share the gospel to all who come for spiritual growth, fellowship, and community.
- **Pohnpei State Corps (Kolonias and Madolenihmw)** – Provided funding for a much-needed Lunch Program that offers a daily meal to 60+ attendees. Within this program, women are taught important life skills that help provide for their families. Three desktop computers were also purchased to help the community college students attend class, which is only offered through online instruction.

## Zimbabwe & Botswana

The Zimbabwe & Botswana Territory recognize that Women's Ministries is very crucial in terms of Corps growth in the Africa Zone. The WM Team proposes to conduct Regional Women's Empowerment and Capacity Building seminars. This project will strengthen their approach to Women's Ministries, empower their women officers and local officers, and build capacity for them to be better equipped to engage in ministry.



The Women's Ministries Department, in collaboration with Divisional Directors of

Women's Ministries, will visit divisions and districts to conduct seminars with the aim of strengthening and empowering women in ministry at the corps level, divisional level, and territorial level.

The aim of the curriculum is to educate women and build their capacity through training and information sessions. These will include, but are not limited to, sessions in Home League Enrollment Lessons, League of Mercy Training, Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, Income Generation, Team Building, General Women's Ministry Information, and Praise and Worship.



For a donation of \$15,000, this program will benefit all expressions of Women's Ministries within the Zimbabwe & Botswana Territory and will benefit the individual leader as well. Two of the six strategic pillars of the Territorial Strategic Plan are 'People' and 'Education', which focus on building capacity in their leaders in order to equip them with needed skills and knowledge for ministry.

## Southern Africa

The Covid-19 pandemic has exposed the country of South Africa to many issues, one of the highest being Gender-Based Violence in their communities. With the national lockdown in March 2020, statistics on GBV went up at a staggering measure. Boys and girls in local communities become highly influenced by this as they witness first-hand their parents physically abusing each other.



Creating an Awareness Campaign would open the door for eight Salvation Army divisions to teach and train our boys and girls against GBV and severe bullying. The trainings would provide a 1-day or full weekend agenda for children to be taught to know their worth in God's kingdom and in society at large. Their learning will include treating one another with care, respect, and love, as well as providing a safe place for children to express their emotions openly.

For a donation of \$15,000, the USA Western Territory can fund this campaign which provides an intentional, active, and creative learning experience on how anger and fear can be resolved without violence. Girls will also be taught self-defense classes which will equip them to defend themselves should an attack on them occur.



## Zambia

Education is a universal right. It is also a matter of justice. But education is not freely available to everyone and in many parts of the world, including Zambia, where girls are the first to be excluded from education due to lack of family finances or because an educated son will make a more significant contribution to the family.



The Salvation Army Zambia Territory believes that every child is entitled to a quality education in a safe environment, resulting in a life as an independent adult. With access to education, young girls can do amazing things: launch climate-smart businesses, become health workers, run schools, and lead governments; making the world a better place for everyone. With this level of education in place, girls in Zambia can earn up to 25% more per year of secondary school, reinvest 90% of their earnings into their families, and are 3 times less likely to become HIV-positive. They can also marry later and have smaller healthier families, invest in their children's education with support to their studies, and resist gender-based violence and discrimination.



With a donation of \$15,000, The USA Western Territory will provide tuition sponsorship of 125 girls in Primary School, tuition sponsorship of 2 young Salvationist women into the university and extend funds for development and operation of a Literacy Program that will train 45 Women's Ministries local officers as Literacy Instructors.
