# Priceless! You are Fully Known!

## I am Known by God

As a child, I never understood how my mother knew if I was really sick or was simply "exaggerating" my illness. As an adult, she let me in on the secret. When I am legitimately not feeling well, my blue eyes turn slatey grey. Guess what. My three kids have the same color eyes and do the exact same thing.

I shared that secret with my husband. Days when I don't feel so well, he can look into my eyes and know if my "I am fine" is true or not. When my eyes disclose the truth, he usually encourages me to go to bed and rest, until I really feel fine. There is something special about being fully known. Until now, only a few people knew that little detail about me.

My mom and my husband know me well, but God knows me even better. He created me—He gave me the blue colored eyes that turn grey when my body is fighting illness. In Psalm 139, David writes about being known by God. Verses 14-17 says, For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be. How precious to me are your thoughts, God! How vast is the sum of them!

God shaped me to be me. He gave me all the physical features—my changing eye color, my height (a little taller would have been nice), the shape of my face (round, really?). He didn't just form me physically, but he made who I am—the personality I have, the gifts and talents I have, even the fact that I am a morning person, is all because God shaped me this way.

At the beginning of Psalm 139, David points out all the things that God knows about him—which is everything. Austin Gentry writes, "Even the smallest moments of our lives—such as our sitting down and rising up—actions we do not even count or consider, God counts and considers."

He knows the good, the bad and the ugly about me, and yet He still adores me. He knew me before I was born, and He knows my days. He knew when I would be born, and He knows when my days will come to an end. He knows things that I don't even know about myself. He knows the number of hair I have on my head: *And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered* (Matthew 10:30). Besides knowing the amount of hair that I have, He also knows my joys and my tears and even a tear that I shed does not go unnoticed by our Heavenly Father. Psalm 56:8 NLT says, *You keep track of all my sorrows. You have collected all my tears in your bottle. You have recorded each one in your book.* 

He knows me—inside and out—the words that I say and even the words that I am thinking (now that can be scary). What a comfort to know that I am known by Him, and even though He knows all about me, He loves me! **You have** searched me, Lord, and you know me (Psalm 139:1).

# Search Me Prayer

David concludes Psalm 139 with a powerful prayer: **Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting** (v. 23-24).

**Search Me.** "Search" in Hebrew means to examine, probe, ascertain, to do a thorough search. David knows that God knows everything about him, but David doesn't know everything that is in his heart. He is asking God to reveal those things deeply hidden in his heart. David is saying to God, "Shine a spotlight on my heart and reveal what is inside me."

**Test Me.** When David prays "test me," he is asking God to bring things into his life that reveals to David how he handles adversity and anxiety. David has already asked God to look at his heart, and now he is asking God to look at his thoughts. Anxious thoughts are any thoughts that cause a person to be troubled, disturbed or disquieted.

**Reveal to Me.** The reason David is asking God to search and test him, is so that God will see and disclose what He discovers to David. David doesn't want God to keep what He discovers as a secret, but to share it with David, to convict him of the sin that lurks in his heart and mind, to show him *any offensive way* that is in him. David knows he is a sinner, and there are thoughts, attitudes and actions that are not like what God desires.

**Lead Me.** David concludes with the desire for God to lead him *in the way everlasting.* David wants to have his sin shown to him, so that he can confess and repent of his sin, and then continue on the path God has for him.

This should be our prayer. We need to ask God to reveal in you what isn't pleasing to Him, so that you can confess and then turn from your sinful actions and thoughts. Spend time daily, praying these verses, and see what God will have you change.

# Psalm 139—A Paraphrase


In his book, *Psalms Now*, Leslie Brandt, writes all the psalms in his own words, making them prayers. Here is how he phrased Psalm 139.

O God, You know me inside and out, through and through. Everything I do, every thought that flits through my mind, every step I take, every plan I make, every word I speak, You know, even before these things happen. You know my past; You know my future. Your circumventing presence covers my every move. Your knowledge of me sometimes comforts me, sometimes frightens me; but always it is far beyond my comprehension.

There is no way to escape You, no place to hide. If I ascend to the heights of joy, You are there before me. If I am plunged into the depths of despair, You are there to meet me. I could fly to the other side of our world and find You there to lead the way. I could walk into the darkest of nights, only to find You there to lighten its dismal hours.

You were present at my very conception. You guided the molding of my unformed members within the body of my mother. Nothing about me, from beginning to end, was hid from Your eyes. How frightfully, fantastically wonderful it all is!

May Your all-knowing, everywhere-present Spirit continue to search out my feelings and thoughts. Deliver me from that which may hurt or destroy me, and guide me along the paths of love and truth.
