I Am Loved Immeasurably

Last month I celebrated my 27th wedding anniversary with my husband. Twenty seven years—that is a long time. On a Wednesday evening in June 1997, my husband bent down on one knee and asked me to marry him. I said yes, and he put a beautiful diamond ring on my finger. Seven months later, he added the gold wedding band. Every day, I glance at my left hand frequently and see the beautiful diamond, and I know I am loved and cherished. My diamond ring is a physical reminder that my husband loves me and chose to spend his life with me!

There is someone who loves me more than my husband (and be assured, my husband loves me a lot!). God loves me! Author Alicia Bruxvort wrote, "*The shape of true love isn't a diamond. It's a cross.*" God loves us and gives us something more precious, priceless and valuable than a diamond. John 3:16 tells us, *For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.*

Why would God do this? 1 John 4:8 declares **God is love.** It is because His very nature, His very essence is love. Love is who He is and what He does. From before time began He had chose to love us: **For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight.** In love he **predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will** (Ephesians 1:4-5). His love is eternal. God declares these words, **"I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness."** (Jeremiah 31:3)

His love for us is undeserved, and it was costly. Romans 5:6-8 proclaims, You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

God showed His love for us by sending His Son, Jesus, who died a horrible and painful death on the cross, to be the payment for our sins. 1 John 3:16 says, *This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters.*

Yes, I love my diamond ring, very much. It is one of my priceless treasures because of what it represents. I will continue to look at my left hand numerous times a day, and relish the fact that I have a husband that loves me very much, but more than that, I will celebrate the fact that God loves me infinitely more! His love for me is immeasurable! Ephesians 3:17b-19 says, *And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.*

Today celebrate the fact that you are immeasurably loved by God!

Sunrise to Sunset Prayers

Thanks to Hallmark cards and the celebration of Valentine's Day, February has become synonymous with love. Since this month is all about love, let's spend the each day this month reminding ourselves that we are God's beloved. We are loved by Him!

Begin every day, as the sun rises, praying this verse as your morning prayer. Focus on that fact that you are loved by a God whose love is unfailing. (okay, if you aren't normally up to watch the sunrise, schedule at least one day this month when you will wake up early and enjoy the sunrise, contemplating God's love for you).

Lord, satisfy me in the morning with Your unfailing love, that I may sing for joy and be glad in all my days. (based on Psalm 90:14)

At the end of your day, or as the sun sets pray this as your prayer. Focus on how God has faithfully shown His love to you throughout the day. (Again, if you don't normally take the time to enjoy a sunset, schedule at least one day this month when you will stop, watch a sunset and focus on God's love for you).

Lord, it is good for me to praise You, and make music to Your name, O Most High. I proclaim Your love in the morning and Your faithfulness at night. (based on Psalm 92:1-2).

"You are Loved" Refrain

A refrain (or chorus) is a regularly recurring phrase or verse especially at the end of each stanza or division of a poem or song. It is that bit of the song that is repeated several times, after each verse. In Psalm 136, you will read a beautiful refrain or chorus 26 times. In each of the twenty-six verses, the psalmist declares the refrain, *His love endures forever.* In the NIV the phrase "his love endures forever" appears a total of 43 times (1 Chronicles 16:34, 41, 2 Chronicles 5;13, 2 Chronicles 7:3, 6, 20:21, Ezra 3:11, Psalm 100:5, 106:1, 107:1, 117:2, 118:1-4, 29, 136:1-26 and Jeremiah 33:11). That is a lot of times to repeat a refrain.



Why is it repeated so much? Repetition emphasizes importance, and the more we repeat

it, the more likely we are to remember it. God wants us to know without a doubt that we are loved, and His love is going to last forever. He will never stop being a God who loves.

Perhaps we should take a lesson from Scripture, and make "His love for me endures forever" a daily refrain. What is something that you do often? Link that activity with reminding yourself that you are loved dearly by God.

Every time you pick up your phone, say "His love endures forever" to yourself. Personalize it, and say "God's love for me endures forever" or "I am forever loved by God." Every time you get into your car, sing the refrain of God's love for you in your mind. Every time I look at my e-mail, I will tell myself "God's love for me endures forever." Will you make God's love the refrain of your day?

"And may you have the power to understand, as all God's people should, how wide, how long, how high, and how deep his love is." Ephesians 3:18 NLT
