An Elephant Never Forgets

The saying “an elephant never forgets” highlights that elephants have impressive memories. They remember locations, social relationships and experiences. Some people have memories like an elephant—they don’t forget anything. Somethings I can remember. I still remember the outfit I wore on my first date with the man who is now my husband. I remember vividly the days each of my 3 children were born. However, ask me what I had for lunch yesterday—and I probably won’t remember.

Then there are things that I remember that I wish I could forget: hurtful words I shouldn’t have said, bad attitudes, not responding graciously at times... You know, those less than stellar moments in my life. Even after I have asked God for forgiveness, I still recall some of my past mistakes (over and over).

Hallelujah, when it comes to our sins, God is not like an elephant. 1 John 1:9, one of the verses I memorized as a child, proclaims: ***If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.*** When I confess my sin to the Lord, He washes me clean. He makes it as if that sin never existed. No lingering evidence is found.

Micah 7:18-19 says, ***Who is God like you, who pardons sin and forgives the transgression of the remnant of his inheritance? You do not stay angry forever but delight to show mercy. You will again have compassion on us; you will tread our sins underfoot and hurl all our iniquities into the depths of the sea.*** It is as if God throws our sins to the bottom of the ocean—never to be seen again. Corrie ten Boom, concentration camp survivor and evangelist wrote:

*“God buries our sins in the depths of the sea and then puts up sign that reads,
‘No fishing.’”*

There is a chorus of a song that says:

*No more! No more! He remembers sins no more,
They are pardoned for ever, and He will never
Bring them up against me any more.
I’ll hear no more of the evil days of yore;
I’m a pardoned offender, and God will remember them no more.
(The Salvation Army Songbook #460)*

God promises in Isaiah 43:25, ***“I, even I, am he who blots out your transgressions, for my own sake, and remembers your sins no more.”***

So don’t be like an elephant who never forgets, rather hold your head up high, God is the forgiver of sins, and you, as a His Daughter, are forgiven!



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Conversation Starters

Gather with some friends and spend some time going deep with conversation around the fact that you have been forgiven by God.

- When have you received forgiveness? What happened? How did it feel to be forgiven?
- When have you offered forgiveness to another person? How did it feel to offer forgiveness?
- Is forgiveness an easy thing for you to do? Is it easier for you to ask for forgiveness or to forgive someone else?
- When you think about all that you have done, and that God forgives you, how does that make you feel?
- Have you ever felt like you have done something so bad that God couldn't possibly ever forgive you for it?
- Do your previous confessed sins still haunt you? How do you handle it? Do you allow the enemy to win in your life by reminding you of the shame?
- What is your favorite verse about God's forgiveness?

Forgiveness Prayers

For this prayer time, you will need a clear jar or vase, soluble vitamin C tablets, or Alka-Seltzer tablets, and water. Fill your jar with water. Hold the tablet in your hand, and think of things that you have done that you need to ask the Lord for forgiveness. Place the tablet in the clear jar. As the tablet is dissolving let it remind you that God completely removes sins from our lives, to never be remembered again:

For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more.

Hebrews 8:12

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9

Do this activity a second time and think of those who you need to forgive, people who have hurt you in some way. As the tablet dissolves, pray and ask the Lord to help you forgive them. Visualize that as the tablet dissolves, you are letting go of the grudge you have been holding.

And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins. Matthew 6:12, 14-15
