Priceless! You are Free!

Freedom!

I remember the first time I lived on my own, and not under my parents' roof. I thought I would have true freedom now that I was setting the rules. I could stay up as late as I want, do (or not do) what I want, eat what I want. It was freedom! Well, so I thought. Soon, I realized that a bedtime wasn't a torture set by my parents; I needed to go to bed at a decent time, because I had to get up and go to work and college in the morning. Yes, I could eat ice cream for breakfast, but I quickly discovered that my body functioned better when I ate nutritious meals, and saved ice cream for an occasional treat. I thought I could ignore the household chores—but soon even that called for my attention. Freedom didn't mean I was free to do whatever I wanted. Bible commentator Warren Wiersbe wrote, "Freedom does not mean I am able to do whatever I want. That's the worse kind of bondage. Freedom means I have been set free to become all that God wants me to be, to achieve all that God wants me to achieve, and to enjoy all that God wants me to enjoy."

In Romans 8:1-2, Paul says this about freedom that comes through Christ: Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death.

Verse 1 speaks of us being <u>free from the guilt or punishment of sin</u>. Because of Jesus Christ's death on the cross, He took the punishment we deserved for our sin. It says there is now no condemnation. God declares those who are in Christ, "not guilty." Jesus was condemned to die so we wouldn't have to. The Passion Translation says it this way: **So now the case is closed. There remains no accusing voice of condemnation against those who are joined in life—union with Jesus, the Anointed One.**

Verse 2 speaks of us being <u>free from the power of sin</u>. The penalty for our sin was paid for us in full by Jesus Christ. We are free from the curse of the law because of His death. We are delivered from the power of sin by His death and resurrection. We have been set free because we are in Christ.


We are free from the punishment of sin, and from the power of sin, so we need to live free—and not let sin enslave us any longer. William Barclay wrote, "Freedom in Christ is not the right to do as one pleases, but the power to do as he ought." Romans 6:6-7 says, For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin—because anyone who has died has been set free from sin.

In The Salvation Army Songbook (2015), song #1037, says this:

**Praise God, I'm saved! Praise God, I'm saved!

**All's well, all's well, He sets me free!

We are free in Christ, so let's live free!


Red, White & Blue Prayers

As we celebrate the 4th of July, and see lots of red, white and blue displayed, use the colors to prompt you to pray the following freedom prayers.

Red reminds us of the blood Jesus shed for us. Thank God for the sacrifice He made on the cross, enabling freedom from sin and its bondage. Thank Him for that fact that we have been freed from guilt, condemnation and the fear of death. Declare that you are free in Christ, and that He has rescued you from the dominion of darkness and brought you into His kingdom of light. Pray for freedom from the lies and deception of the enemy of our souls.

<u>White</u> symbolizes purity. Because of Christ's death, we have freedom from the power of sin. However, we still have sin in our lives. Pray and ask the Lord for help in overcoming temptations and struggles, and in walking in truth and righteousness. Pray for strength to reject sin and live according to His will. Pray for freedom from habitual sin, specific temptations, or unhealthy patterns in your life.

<u>Blue</u> represents calmness and trust. Ask for freedom from anxiety, fear, insecurity, and worry. Pray for freedom from the control of anger or other destructive emotions. Offer your life to God, surrendering every aspect to His control and guidance.


